Hong Kong Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation

Hong Kong Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation (HKCPEC) was set up in March 1990 to advise the Government on matters relating to the participation of Hong Kong in the Pacific Economic Cooperation Council (PECC).

HKCPEC is tripartite in nature comprising representatives from the academic, business and government sectors. Professor Sung Yun-wing, Chairman and Professor of Department of Economics of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, is the current HKCPEC Chairman. The HKCPEC is serviced by the Trade and Industry Department.

Hong Kong joined PECC in May 1991, and has continued to be a separate and full member under the name of "Hong Kong, China" (HKC) since 1 July 1997. Since its establishment, HKCPEC has been participating actively in PECC. Hong Kong, China was the Chair of PECC during 1999-2001 and hosted the 14th General Meeting of PECC (PECC XIV) in November 2001.

Apart from participating in PECC projects, seminars and meetings, the focus of HKCPEC in recent years has been reaching out to the general public, in particular the business sector and young people. A series of programmes have been conducted to publicise regional cooperation matters and the work of PECC and HKCPEC.

Since 2004, HKCPEC has organised seminars on different subjects covering Closer Economic Partnership Arrangement (CEPA) with the Mainland, regional bond markets, sustainable tourism industry, World Trade Organisation Doha Development Agenda, and environmental protection. In 2005, HKCPEC and the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups (HKFYG) jointly organised the first Youth Learning Project on Pacific Economic Cooperation. Building on the success of the first project, the second and third Youth Learning Projects were organised jointly by HKCPEC and HKFYG in 2006/07 and 2008/09.
