

Individually Owned Stores

1. What are the differences between the liberalisation measures for individually owned stores and other service sectors under CEPA?

Different from the other CEPA liberalisation measures on Trade in Services, Hong Kong permanent residents with Chinese citizenship can set up individually owned stores in the Mainland without the need to apply for a Certificate of Hong Kong Service Supplier and without being subject to the approval procedures applicable to foreign investments. It helps to increase the flexibility for Hong Kong residents to invest and tap the business opportunities in the Mainland. The CEPA provisions on individually owned stores are complementary to the other liberalisation measures under CEPA Trade in Services, bringing more and different investments opportunities to Hong Kong residents.
