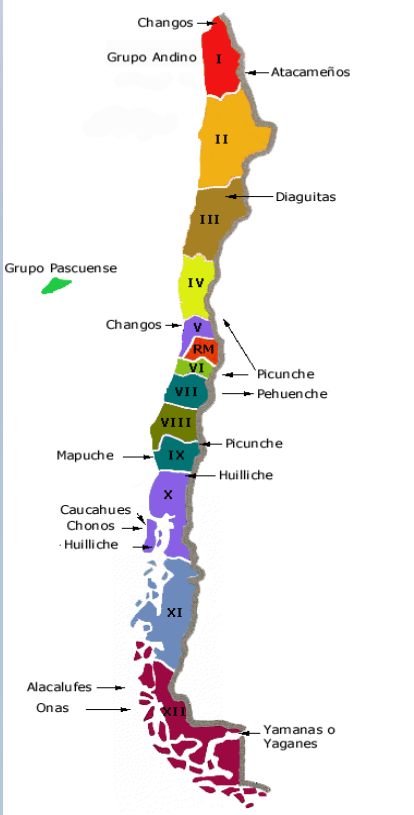

# CHILE

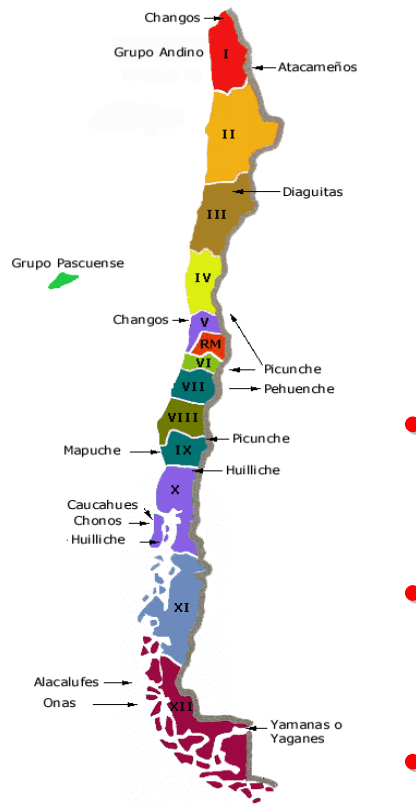
- Chile is located in South America, between the Pacific Ocean and Andes Mountains.
- Chile`s geography is long and narrow, with 4300 kms by long.
- The insular part is composed of many islands. Easter Island is the most famous.
- Chile is a democracy, the country`s capital is Santiago.



# CHILE

- Population: **15.5** million .
- Entrance per capita : US\$ **8.900** (Gross Domestic Product)  
In 2006 increasing **5.5%**
- Total Trade 2006: **90.719** million (US\$)
- In 2006 Chilean total trade grew **33%**
- Literacy rate : **95%**
- Inflation : **3.8 %**
- unemployment : **8.5 %**



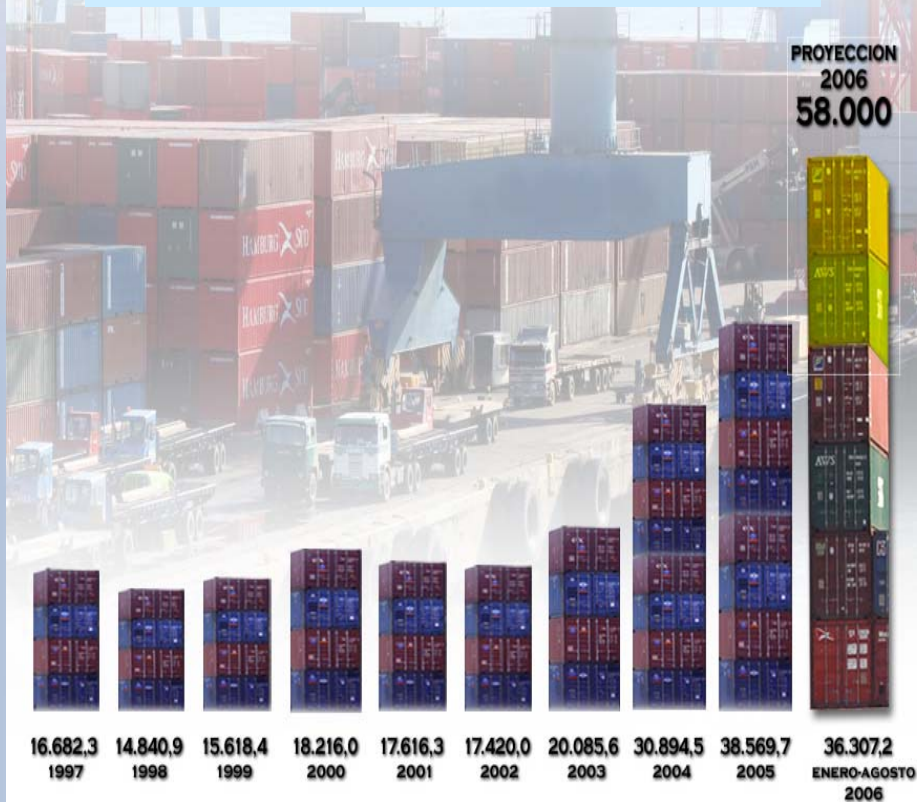


# Chile: Development Strategy

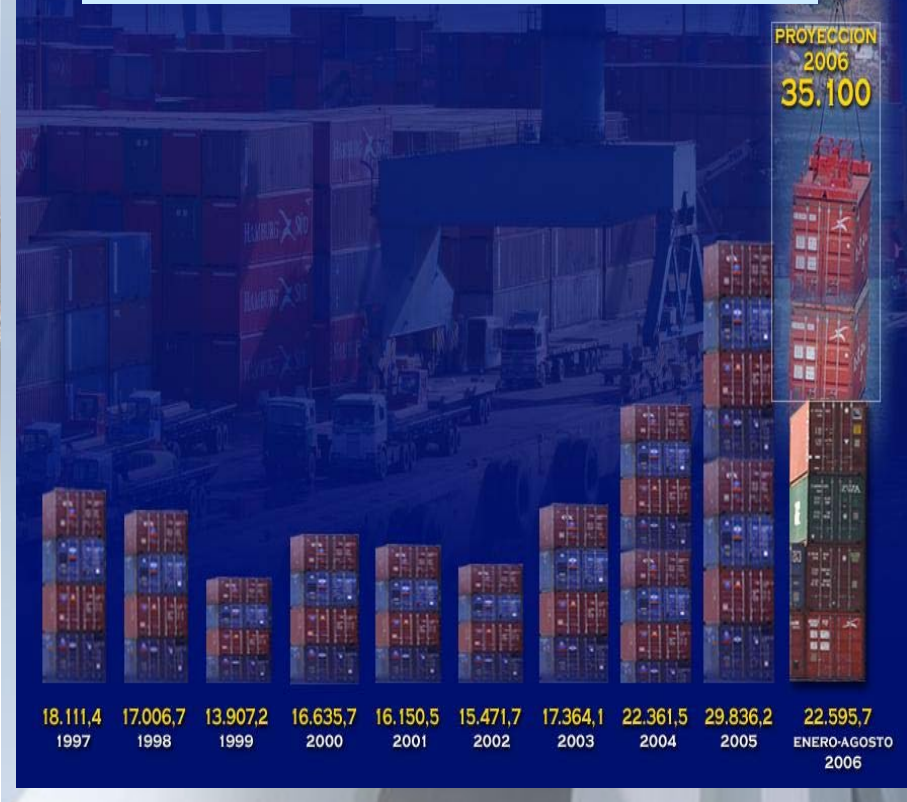
# CHILEAN FOREIGN TRADE

US\$ 56 Billion

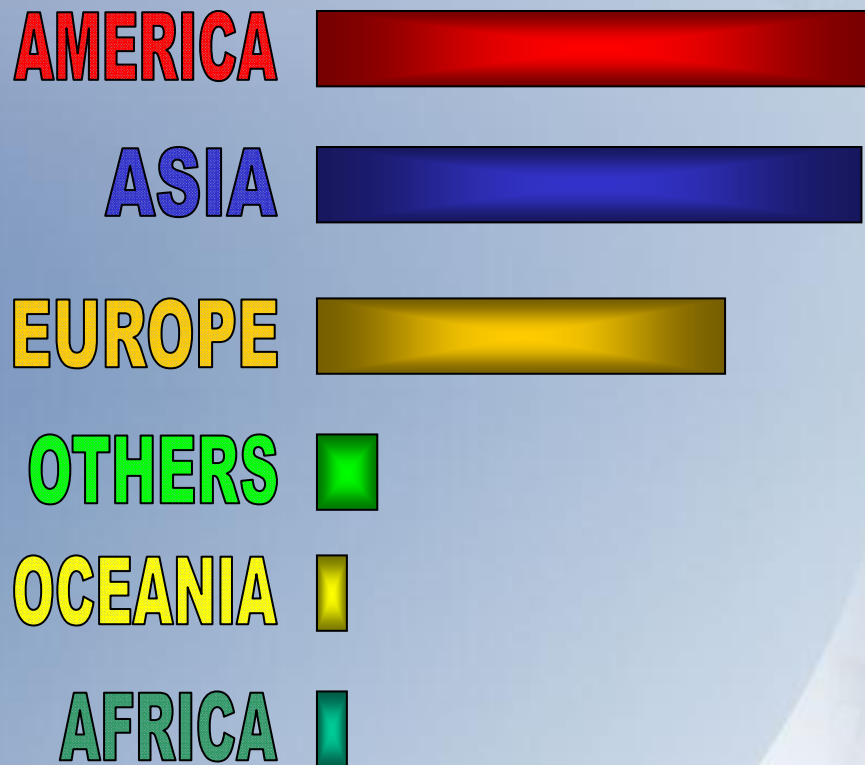
Annual Imports

## DISTRIBUTION OF CHILEAN EXPORTS 2006

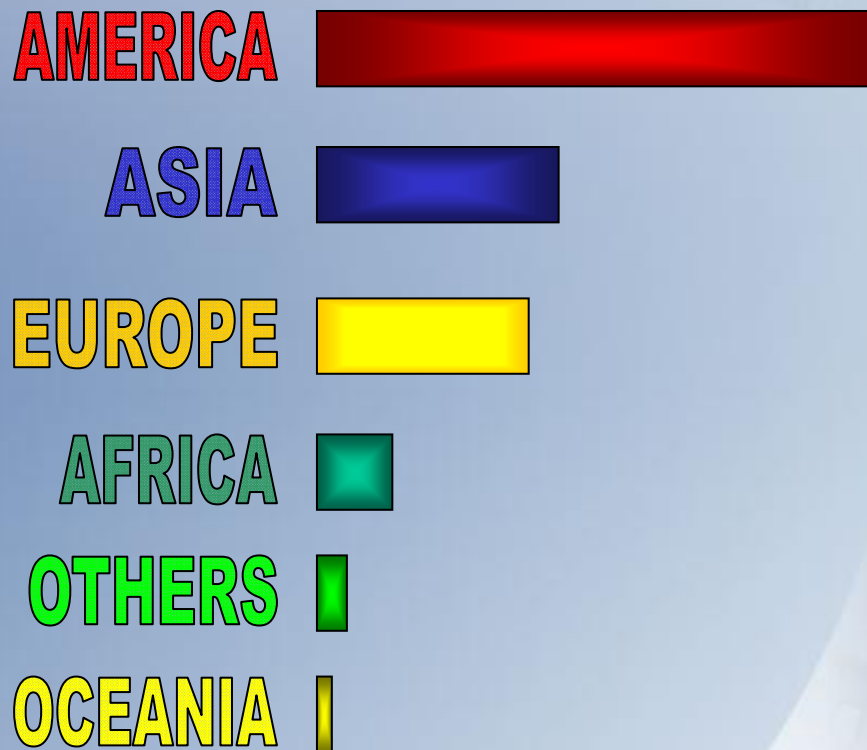

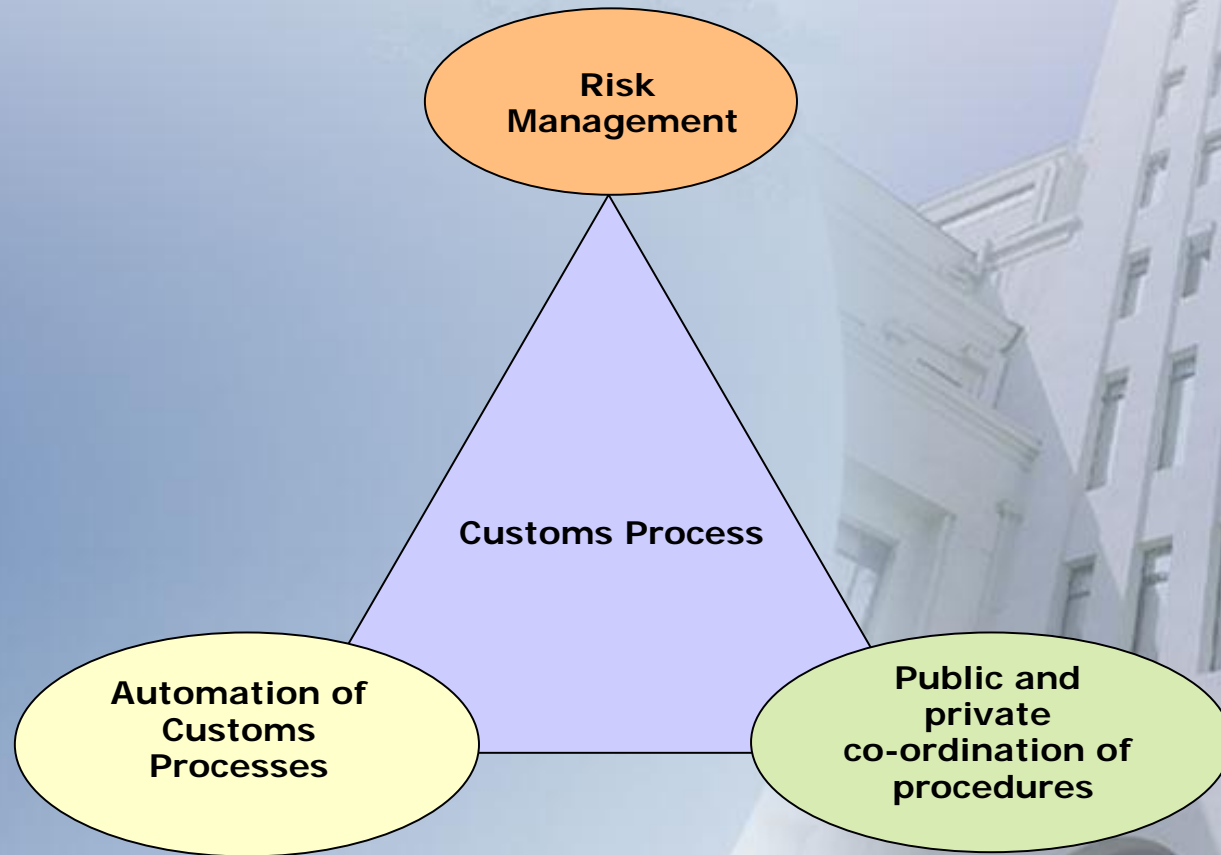

# Integrated Access Control System to Port Terminal



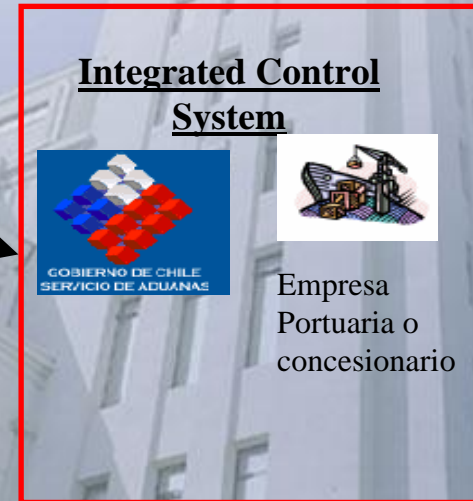

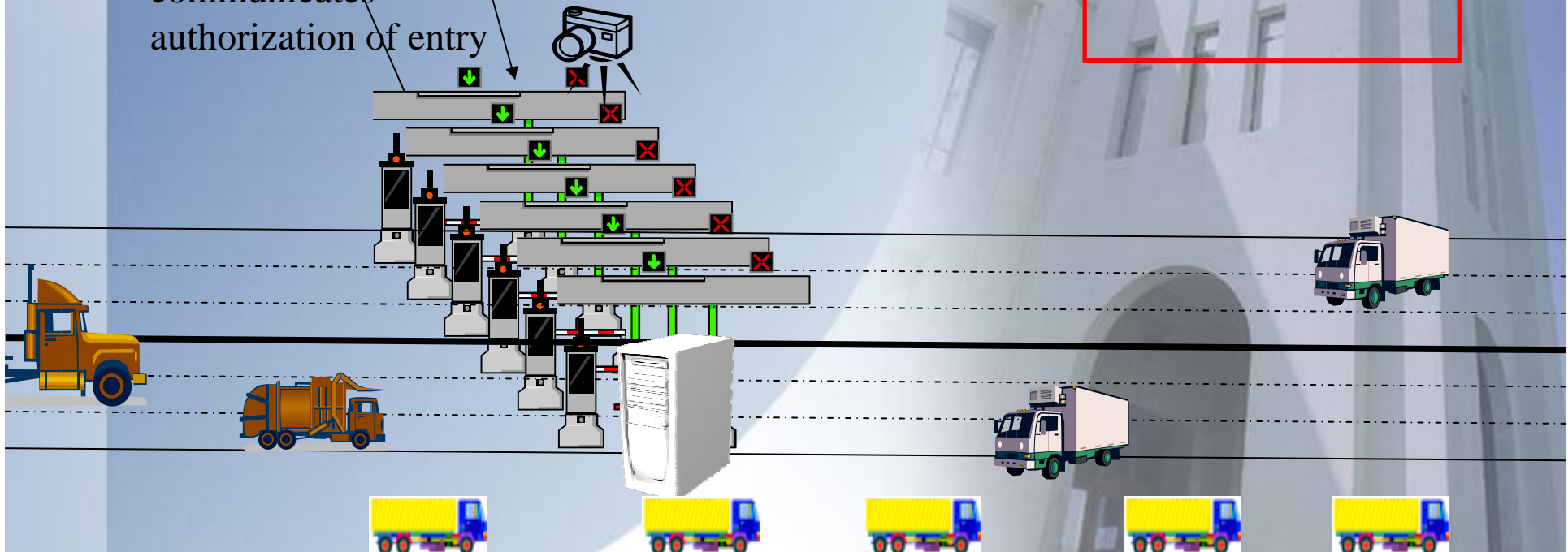

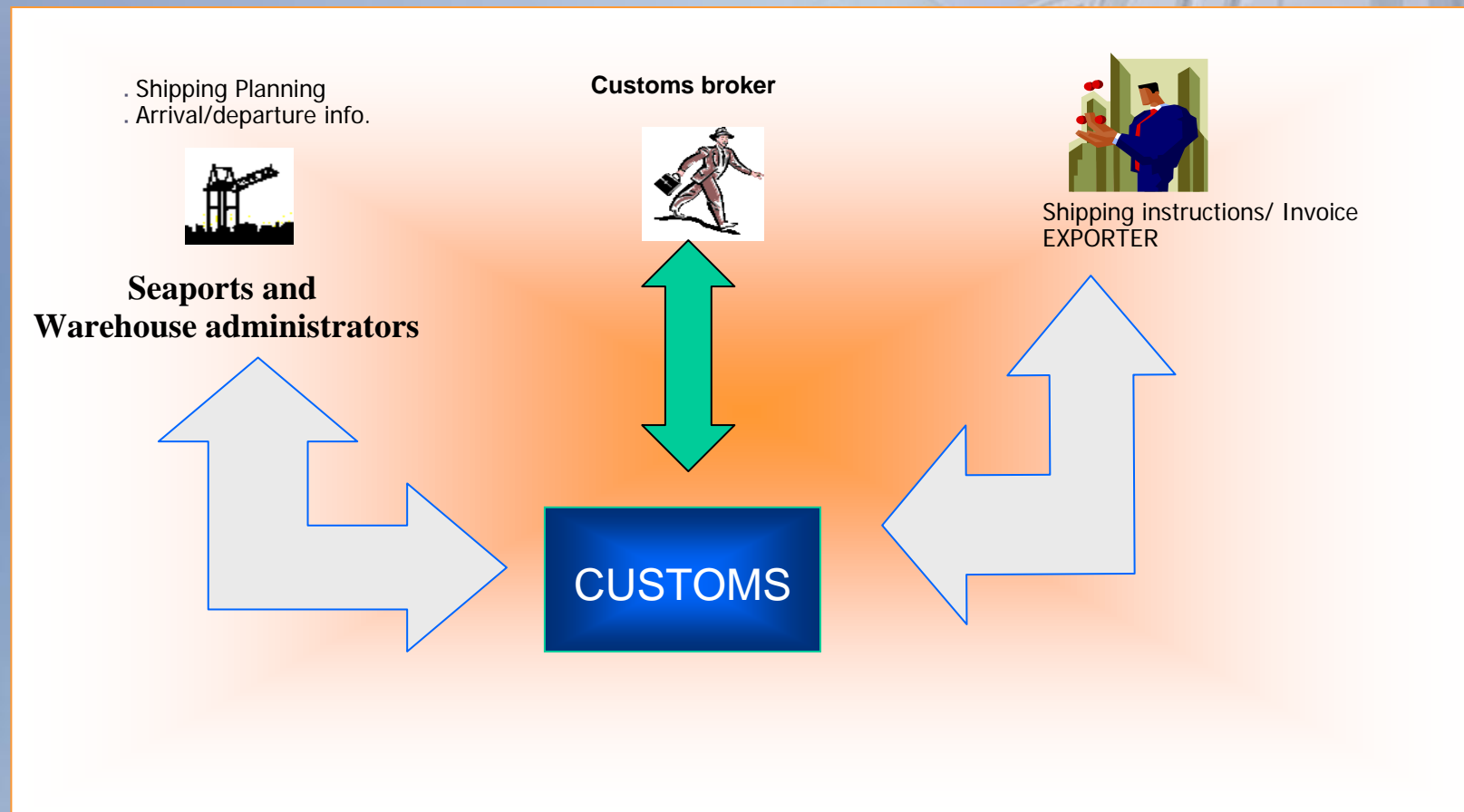
## **PRINCIPAL MEASURES**

- Co-ordinate procedures and information by **INTERNET** with Seaports and Warehouse administrators in Chile, working together.
- Early sending of whole documentation in electronic format.
- Review of the operations in early form
- ❑ Goods are targeted for physical inspection through risk management techniques
- Control of access to terminals is automatic and Chilean customs only supervise it.
- Physical inspection is carried out as per entry of goods into Primary Zone.

## OPERATION SCHEME
