

- Chile is a democracy, the country's capital is Santiago.




CHILE

- Population: 15.5 million .

- In 2006 Chilean total trade grew 33%

- Inflation : 3.8 %
- unemployment : 8.5 %


Optimize the Use of resources

PRINCIPAL MEASURES

- Co-ordinate procedures and information by INTERNET with Seaports and Warehouse administrators in Chile, working together.
- Early sending of whole documentation in electronic format.
- Review of the operations in early form
- Goods are targeted for physical inspection through risk management techniques
- Control of access to terminals is automatic and Chilean customs only supervise it.
- Physical inspection is carried out as per entry of goods into Primary Zone.


