# Trade Facilitation (1)

Why Important?

- As tariffs become lower, greater significance of non-tariff costs

Direct & indirect costs\* of trade transactions are estimated at around few to several percent -- UNCTAD(1994), OECD (2003) \*mostly time delays

- Post-9/11 environment

Greater need to balance security & facilitation

## Trade Facilitation (2)

Trade Facilitation: one of six issues in Doha Round "Single Undertaking"

APEC

TFAP2 another 5% reduction of transaction costs by 2010

SW Initiative: assist development of Single Windows in APEC economies

WCO

SAFE (FoS): standards to balance security & facilitation of int'l trade

AEO : C –B partnership to provide benefits to traders w/ good compliance

Japanese Bilateral FTAs/EPAs
Includes chapter on Customs Procedures & Cooperation for TF & TACB

#### "Asia Gateway Initiative" Priorities

## Improve infrastructure for Gateway functions

- Trade Procedures Restructuring
   Program
- "Asia Open Sky" for Kansai & Chubu airports
- Attractive financial market to network w/ other Asian markets
- Special Economic Zones to promote e.g. trade

## Promote cultural & academic interchange

- Internationalization of universities
- Triple number foreign students by 2025
- Strengthen cooperation/research hub functions on common regional issues e.g. environment & energy
- Promote Japanese culture & media contents

#### Goals

- Hub for people/goods/money/information in Asia & world
- Interact with Asia, deliver Asian values to RoW & vice versa

#### Trade Procedures Restructuring Program

Streamlined regulations and procedures

e.g.

- a) Harmonize port procedures throughout Japan (by March 2008)
- b) Review procedures to reduce cost & time (e.g. requirement to store export goods in bonded areas) (by March 2008)

Improvement of AEO system

e.g.

- a) Harmonize intragov. compliance programs
- b) Promote G2G dialogue for possible mutual recognition

e.g. US, China, Korea, Australia, NZ "Next Generation"
Single Window
(October 2008)

e.g.

- a) "Open" system that reflects BPR
- b) Develop linkage with international Single Windows

(e.g. ASEAN SW)

Promote Simplified Export Declaration system (Customs-Business Partnership) to cover 50% of exports by end-2008
